
S.R.C Chit Chat

NAPI AN online 2019

During Week 9 our Year 3 and 5 students will be participating in the NAPLAN Online Practice Test 2019.

Year 3: Monday 1st April 1:30pm - 2:50pm Year 5: Friday 5th April 11:25am – 12:40pm

Students who are absent on their day will be given an opportunity to participate in the practice test on another day.

The 45-minute test includes Numeracy, Conventions of Language and Reading questions, but not Writing. The focus of this test is also readiness for schools to enhance test administrators' familiarity with the assessment delivery platform, to increase confidence in test administration processes for both test administrators and students, and to ensure the ICT infrastructure within the school and classroom has sufficient capacity for the online assessment.

Students, teachers and parents can also use the Public demonstration site (https://www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/ public-demonstration-site) to become familiar with NAPLAN Online.

As matter of equity, all parents and guardians who are not in receipt of Student Assistance Scheme (STAS) are expected to organise payment of levies. Payments can be made in full or alternatively agreeing to an ongoing payment plan over the course of the school year.

- •At the school; we accept cash and cheques.

When using BPAY to pay school levies, please ensure that you are using the correct Reference Number, Biller Id and student Number, as this will then allow your payment to be applied correctly.

When paying two or more invoices (each invoice has a unique number) at the one time it is advisable to make separate transactions especially when part-payments are being made on more than one invoice otherwise this appears as one bulk payment which does not indicate which invoice the payment relates to.

Friday 22 March was National Ride2School Day. This was the perfect opportunity for students and the school community to embrace a healthier start and to try walking and riding to school for themselves.












