### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Carers,

Our past week has been extremely busy. We have almost completed all of our NAPLAN tests. Despite media reports we can advise that our online testing went very smoothly. The students became very adept at logging in to the website and being test ready. Any issues we had were only minor issues that were easily solved. At this time we are unsure when the results will be available but as educators we will be interested to see how students have managed the new format. The feedback from students has been positive and negative.

Last Friday we had Walk Safely To School Day. Approximately 90 students were able to walk from their homes to school or joined in the walk from the Village Green to school. Numbers this year were much greater than last year. The P&F put on another wonderful breakfast of toast, fruit and milk drinks. We gratefully acknowledge the generous support of Ashgrove Dairy for donating 18 litres of milk.

On Saturday the P&F held a BBQ and Cake stall at the polling booth. This was a great success with approximately \$950 being raised. The Grade 5/6 parent group also had their stall at the Anglican Market and raised money to support the Canberra camp. A very successful day.

On Sunday our Maypole Dancers did two demonstrations in Launceston's Kingsway as part of the Day on the Kingsway section of the Breath of Fresh Air Film festival. The students did an awesome job and danced with big smiles on their faces. At the completion of the second demonstration a member of the audience introduced himself to Sarah as a visitor from England and he was surprised and delighted to find Maypole Dancing in Launceston. No doubt he will share his experience when he goes back to the UK. Many thanks to Tim Rixon of Travenco Engineering who transported the base and pole to the Kingsway and back to school. Looking to the future, this year celebrates 150 years of public education in Tasmania and 180 years of schooling in Westbury. We plan to have a celebration about education early in Term 4 and are seeking enthusiastic people to form a committee to bring the celebration to life. ## Taming the technology

How to use parental controls and other tools to maximise online safety in your home.

### Know your devices

All the devices that connect to the internet in your home offer lots of benefits. But you also need to understand the risks associated with these devices and how to protect yourself and your family.

### Use parental controls

Parental controls are software tools that allow you to monitor and limit what your child sees and does online.

They can be set up to do things like:

- **block** your child from accessing specific websites, apps or functions (like using a device's camera, or the ability to buy things)
- **filter** different kinds of content — such as 'adult' or sexual content, content that may promote self-harm, eating disorders, violence, drugs, gambling, racism and terrorism
- allow you to **monitor** your child's use of connected devices, with reports on the sites they visit and the apps they use, how often and for how long
- set **time limits**, blocking access after a set time

## BEDWETTING

The Child Health and Parenting Service (CHaPS) offers the Wetaway Program to children 5-18 years of age, who have problems achieving night time dryness.

*Nocturnal Enuresis* is a medical term used to describe persistent bedwetting. Bladder control occurs at different ages in different children, but dryness at night can be expected by 5-6 years of age.

The Wetaway Program is for children who are motivated to stop wetting the bed and have an adult willing to support them. The Program usually takes 2-3 months to complete.
