I am sure there will be more events than those above. Please keep an eye on the newsletter and the school Facebook page for details.

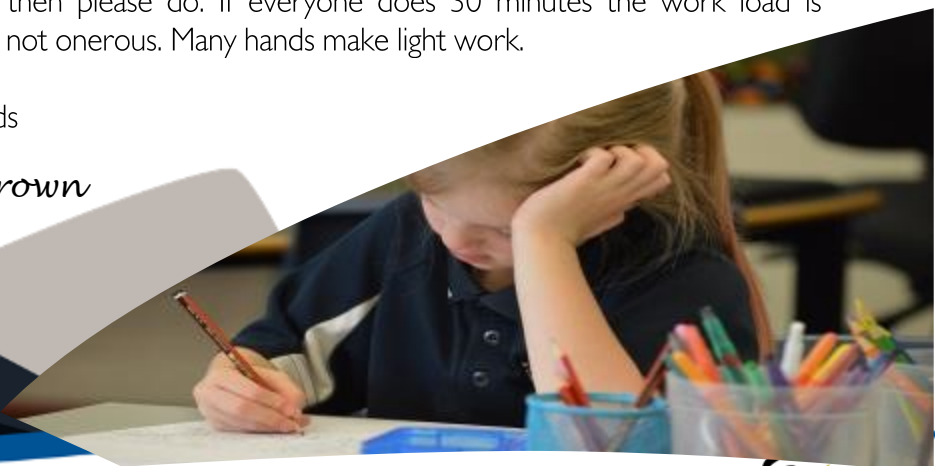

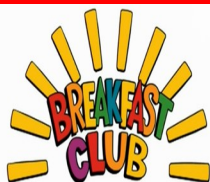

Cake Stall - Westbury 180 School Fair - Friday 25 October.

Westbury Primary Parents & Friends will be running a Cake Stall at the Westbury 180 School Fair next Friday, 25 October.

We are asking families to contribute by **donating items** for the stall. Baked goods such as cakes, slices, biscuits, cupcakes, truffles etc are most welcome. Slices can be delivered uncut and all items should have an ingredients list supplied.

Donations for the cake stall are to be delivered to the Parent Room on the MORNING of Thursday 24 October &/or Friday 25 October.

Due to health and safety issues we are not able to sell 'high risk' foods such as cream, raw eggs, meat or custard as we will not have the ability to store them under refrigeration.

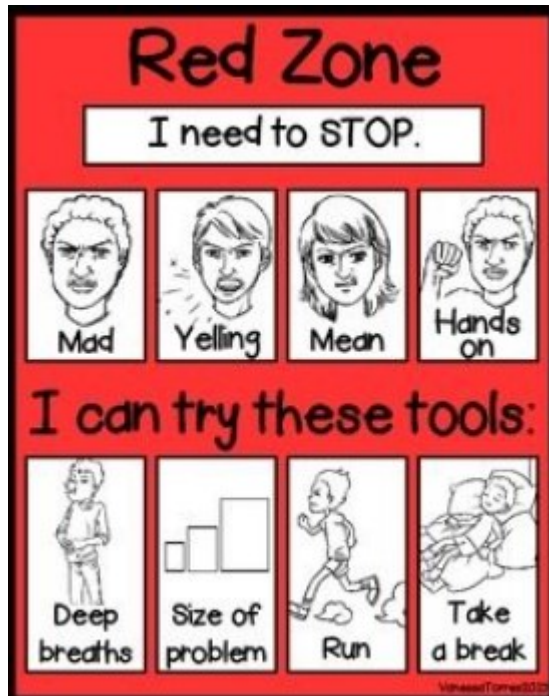

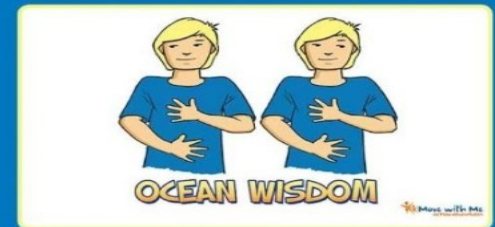

Reading with children is a proven way to promote literacy. By putting a few simple strategies into action you can make a significant contribution to your child's reading in as little as 20 minutes per day. Here are a few ideas you can apply when reading with your child.

Read from a variety of books, including fairy tales, poems, comics and information books.

When you come to a new word, take this opportunity to talk about it in interesting ways that your child will enjoy and learn from. For example, "This big house is called a palace. Who do you think lives in a palace?" Search for palaces on your phone/computer so your child can visualize them.

Stop and ask about the pictures and about what is happening in the story.

Read with emotion. Reading with emotion draws a child into the story in a way that is much more memorable and enjoyable. It also helps them to better understand how words can describe something sad, happy, or exciting.

Take your child to the library to check out books. This is an affordable way to give your child access to a wide range of books.

Play this math card game alone, in a pair or as a team. Lay out 20 cards on the table face up. Begin by removing sets of cards that add up to 10, ultimately trying to remove all the cards from the table (aces equal 1). The person, pair or team with the most sets win!

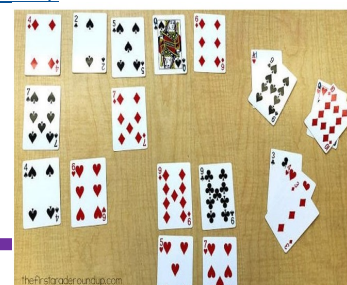
